Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO) - Ottawa Children's Treatment Centre (OCTC) is one of a kind - unique in both care provision and passion. CHEO Research Institute is the fastest growing RI in Canada. University of Ottawa is a research-intensive university, currently in the top 10 in Canada. Located within the heart of the nation's capital, Ottawa, these interconnected institutions are health and research centers that provide outstanding family-centered patient care, pioneering breakthrough research, and train the health care professionals of tomorrow. The Department of Pediatrics, linking with all of these institutions, is a dynamic department serving a large geographical area with a population base of 1.8 million. In addition, with the proximity to Quebec and the availability of bilingual services, children from Western Quebec are referred and treated at CHEO. CHEO also provides care to the pediatric patient population of Baffin region requiring tertiary level treatment and care.

CHEO-OCTC is recruiting a general pediatrician in a hospitalist role for patients admitted under subspecialty and surgical teams. This is an opportunity to increase one's exposure and comfort in treating children with chronic medical conditions such as IBD, Sickle Cell Anemia, seizure disorders, and oncologic issues from the unique vantage point of a generalist. The main focus of clinical work is on stabilization and follow up of acute medical issues related to the child's hospitalization. Identification and management of general pediatric issues in this interesting population with close collaboration with subspecialists in the care of these patients is important. The team size varies between 4 and 10 patients. This role also provides ample opportunity to supervise and teach trainees. Your input as a generalist is highly valued in these cases. Working with subspecialists provides a unique learning opportunity for the spectrum of care for these common chronic pediatric medical conditions which will be an asset to future work as a hospitalist in settings where there is less subspecialist support.

The successful candidate will have extensive opportunity to develop hospital clinical skills in relation to care of the hospitalized child with a variety of chronic pediatric medical conditions and engage in teaching of house-staff in the context of clinical care. They will be appointed at the University of Ottawa with status of Lecturer.

The candidate will be Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (Pediatrics) certified/eligible or equivalent, with specific interest in inpatient pediatric care. Fluency in both English and French would be an advantage.

CHEO-OCTC is committed to Employment Equity and welcomes applications from all qualified men and women, including aboriginal people, visible minorities and persons with disabilities. In accordance with the Canadian immigration requirements, priority will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents of Canada.
