

The Department of Pediatrics at McMaster University and McMaster Children's Hospital is seeking a full-time academic physician to join the Division of Adolescent Medicine. The Division of Adolescent Medicine provides important services within McMaster Children's Hospital (MCH). MCH is the pediatric regional referral centre for a population of more than 2.3 million in south central Ontario. The Division has one of the busiest eating disorder programs in the country with a large outpatient program, a new 6-bed inpatient unit, and a new 4-bed day hospital program. The Division also has a busy and expanding adolescent medicine program that provides assessment and treatment to youth with chronic illness, chronic pain, mental health concerns, sexual health concerns, conversion disorders as well as other psychosomatic issues. Experience or special training working with trans and gender diverse youth would be an asset. IUD insertion skills would also be an asset.

The successful candidate will be considered a clinician-educator but will also provide support to the Divisional and Departmental research activities. The successful incumbent will be expected to share in the clinical responsibilities of the Adolescent Medicine service while promoting the profile of McMaster University and McMaster Children's Hospital through research and educational endeavours.

Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in Adolescent Medicine and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario.

Anticipated start date is April 1, 2019. Review of Applications will begin December 1, 2018 and continue until the position is filled.
